Kuroyu Black Water Hot Spring








Cultural experience classes



Various classes are offered enabling participants to enjoyably experience aspects of Japanese culture, ranging from the traditional culture that has been passed down in Japan since long ago, to the popular culture that represents Japan of today. Traditional Japanese culture

Visitors can experience aspects of "traditional culture" that were developed based on the unique evolution of Japan over a long period of time.



Calligraphy experience

This is an experience of Japanese calligraphy using brushes and ink, Words will be written in Japanese with hiragana and kanii alphabets, etc.





Tea ceremony experience

Participants can experience an authentic tea ceremony in a tatami mat room. The origins of Japanese-style hospitality are learned through the "way of tea." A seasonal Japanese

Flower arrangement experience

Participants have an experience in which they decorate vases with seasonal plants and flowers, etc. and thereby gain an aesthetic appreciation of traditional Japanese art.





Kimono wearing experience

Kimono clothing is offered to both men and women. Participants can experience the dressing process for a kimono, which is unique to Japan.





Experience of handcrafting Japanese accessories

Visitors can make accessories and miscellaneous items with traditional Japanese designs that are characteristic of Japan, using materials such as Japanese paper and crape.
